## Clues:

- 1) After the war, this place served as the Tuberculosis treatment centre of Tan Tock Seng Hospital and was run by a group of Catholic nuns who worked as nurses.
- 🤊 70 Martaban Road
- 2) His eldest daughter was the first female Barrister in Singapore in 1929. Who is he?

- 3) Tan Chor Lam purchased bilingual editions of Chinese classics for his English-educated daughter as he wanted his children to develop an appreciation of Chinese literature and Confucian ethics.

- 4) She (second from right) joined Nanyang Girls' High School as a teacher and later became the principal of the school. Do you know who she is?

- 5) This place used to house the Tan Tock Seng Hospital's nurses from 1957-1995 and was subsequently used as an administrative office until 1999.

- 6) An architect and wife of the former President Mr Ong Teng Cheong, she was the first Asian woman to obtain her Bachelor of Architecture from the University of Adelaide, Australia.

- 7) Regarded as the "Forgotten revolutionary female" and "The first revolution partner" of Dr. Sun Yat Sen, Chen Cuifen (seated in front of Mr Lim Nee Soon) made many contributions to the revolutionary activities.

- 8) This place was built in 1926 to house migrant women who worked as seamstresses, cooks or housekeepers. These women had to be vegetarian, remain single and perform Buddhist rites in order to stay there.

- 9) This place was where the main buildings of Tan Tock Seng Hospital were when it first moved to its present location in 1909. Its structure adapted the design of the "Nightingale wards" that was invented by Florence Nightingale in the 1850s.
